5.	Project Sustainability. Does the project include training or professional development that will facilitate future research or project sustainability? Does the project further collaborative efforts among individuals or organizations? Does the project have any community involvement? How will the project continue after IAATE funding ends? (300 word limit)
6.	Budget Description: Provide a brief budget narrative, including how IAATE funds will be used. If the proposal is to fund an on-going project, pleas provide the previous funding sources. If partial funding is granted, will the project still be achievable? If "yes", how will the project be altered? (200 word limit)
